BELL COUNTY VEHICLE REGISTRATION ENCOURAGES ONLINE OR MAILED IN RENEWALS IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19 CORONAVIRUS

Belton, Texas - March 15, 2020: The COVID-19 coronavirus outbreak has caused widespread disruption throughout the world and at home. At the Bell County Tax Assessor- Collector's Office, we believe it is our role and responsibility to continue providing essential government services while implementing preventative measures to ensure the health of the public and our employees during this time.

As such, we in the Tax Assessor-Collector's Office/Vehicle Registration want to encourage members of the public to submit their inquiries to our office via email Vehicle.Registration@bellcounty.texas.gov instead of visiting us in person when possible. This is a safer option to provide the highest-level of services during this public health challenge.

Our office HIGHLY encourages you to MAIL or go ONLINE at www.txdmv.gov to renew your vehicle registration and leave office visits to title work when possible.

The good news, we have our new queuing system in place that will allow you to make your appointment online should you need to come into our offices for vehicle registration services -- limiting your time you are in our office.

How Do I Make An Appointment?

2. Click the RED 'Make Appointments Online at Belton, Killeen or Temple Offices'
3. Select the office most convenient to you
4. Complete the Appointment Form

At this time, please understand that longer wait times for services may occur while public access to our offices is limited and precautions for unnecessary exposure and social distancing practices are in place.
